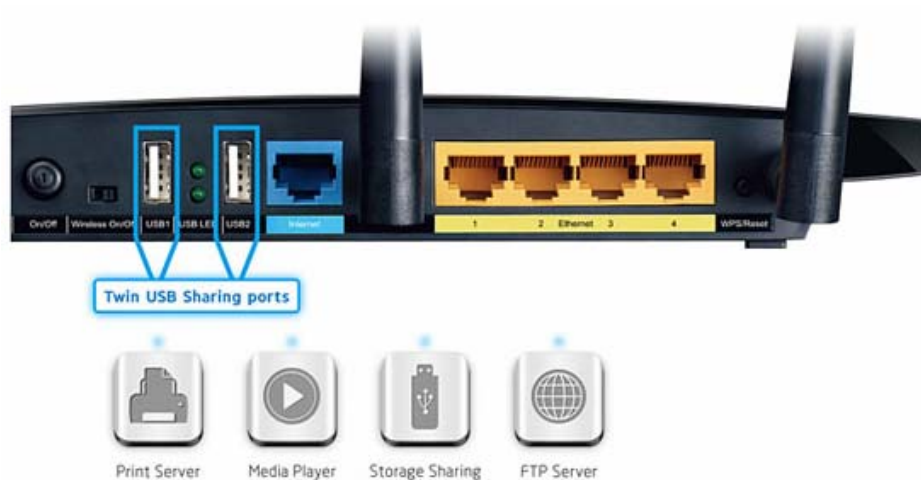


How to Use the Media Server Feature

The Media Server feature allows you to share music, videos and photos from a USB or Mobile hard disk drive that's connected to the router, to game consoles or media players in the same network.

HOW TO SET UP:

Plug the USB storage into the USB port of the TP-LINK router and wait until the USB LED is solid green.

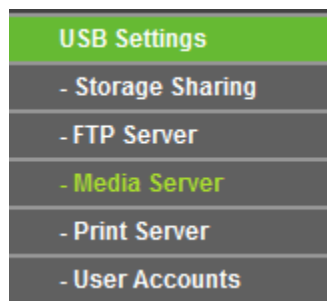


You can setup the media server by the following steps:

Step 1 Open a web browser (IE/Chrome/Firefox/Safari), type **tplinklogin.net** in the address bar, and then press Enter button.

Step 2 Type the username and password in the login page, and then click OK to log into the router. *The default username and password are both **admin** (in lower case.)*

Step 3 Click **USB Settings** -> **Media Server** on the left side menu.



Step 3 Click **Start** button. *The USB storage device must be recognized before configuring the Media Server.*

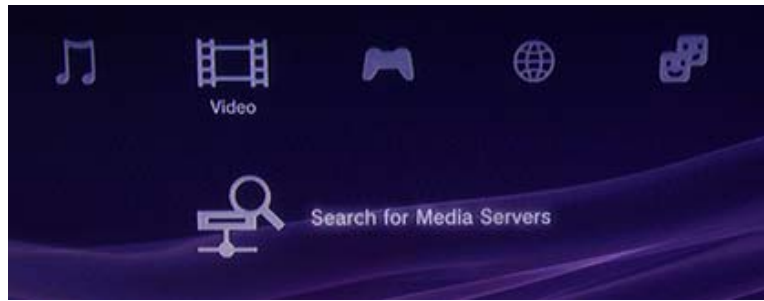
Step 5 Your shared folders will be listed on the Media Server page.

 The TP-LINK Media Servers that can be connected will be displayed.

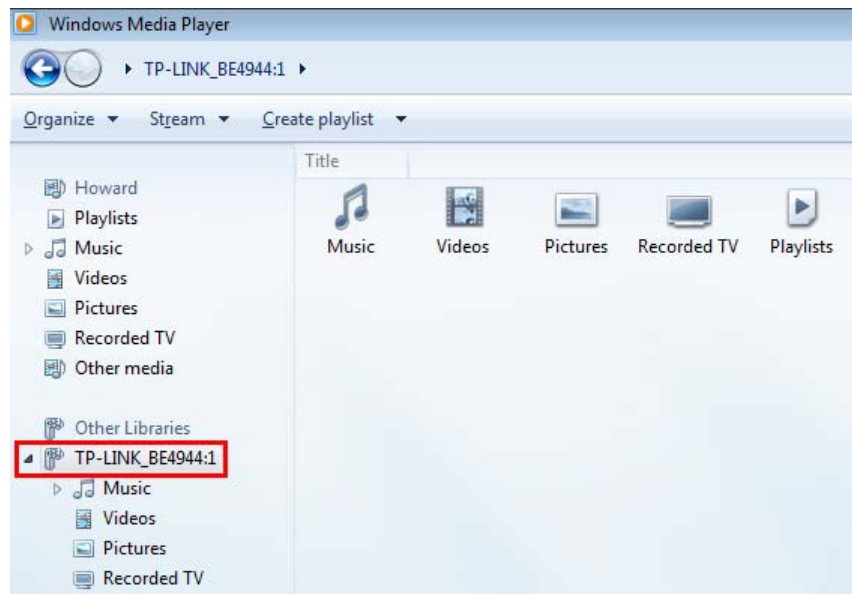


Access the Media Server on XBOX360
